

At Godshill Primary School we understand that the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children is invaluable. We also believe that PE and School Sport (PESS) plays a crucial role in the overall performance of our children and that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum alongside extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, attitude and achievement.

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive a minimum of 2 hours of PE per week, delivered by highly trained and enthusiastic teachers. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing children's physical literacy skills and experiences.

We organise a Sports Day, inter and intra school competitions every year. These include festivals in a range of sports with our federated schools and entering school teams in cluster and island competitions.

Teachers and TAs provide a wide range of after school sports clubs, both for team and individual sports. Being a small school, Godshill Primary also relies on the support and commitment of parents working with our staff, which is very much appreciated.

Having assessed the specific needs of our individual children, we have collectively decided to invest a large proportion of the funding available on sporting, taster-experiences. These range from golf, skateboarding and archery. The aim was to provide children with opportunities to invest in sports that they wouldn't normally have access to.

What is the Sports Premium?

The government has been providing funding of £150 million per annum for the last few years to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. The funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport

This Year's Funding

In July, The Education Secretary announced the PE and Sports Premium is being increased nationally from 160 million to 320 million. It means that from September 2017 the amount of money schools receive will increase significantly. The government is providing funding of £320 million per annum for the academic years 2017/18. The money goes directly to primary school to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. At Godshill we are very excited by this news as it allows to build on the super work the children have been doing over the past few years and increase the opportunities we provide them and help further achieve the aims of our PE curriculum.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- Delivery will be monitored by the PE Leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at senior level by the Executive Headteacher and Head of School.
- Monitor the take-up of extra-curricular activities.
- Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by school staff, volunteers and outside agencies to ensure that provision is of high quality.
- Review work will also be carried out by the Primary School Games Organisers who are working to ensure effective delivery through the local sports partnership and cluster events.
